NEW PUBLICATIONS

Charities Directorate Provides Guidance on Gifts In Kind

by Terrance S. Carter, assisted by Nancy E. Claridge, in Charity Law Bulletin No.44 May 31, 2004.

The "*Registered Charities Newsletter, No. 18*" ("*Newsletter*"), dated March 29, 2004, from the Canada Revenue Agency (formerly Canada Customs and Revenue Agency) ("CRA") focuses on receipting issues concerning gifts in kind, as well as a commentary on charitable donation tax shelter arrangements. Issuing receipts for gifts in kind requires that a charity be knowledgeable in valuation procedures and standards, as well as the impact of gifts on the overall disbursement quota of a charity. This issue requires careful consideration by a charity and its board of directors, as failure to properly assess and consider the tax consequences of a gift in kind may lead to penalties, including possible revocation of a charity's status as a registered charity. This *Charity Law Bulletin* ("*Bulletin*") provides a brief review of the directives given by CRA on gifts in kind as provided in the *Newsletter*, which is available at www.ccra-adrc.gc.ca/E/pub/tg/charitiesnews-18/news18-e.html.

Incorporating a Charitable or Not-for-Profit Organization

Chapter 3 of The Law of Charitable and Not-for-Profit Organizations: Third Edition by Donald J. Bourgeois, is now available on our site. May 2004.

The corporate form is a useful and common method for an organization to carry on charitable and not-forprofit activities. It provides limited liability for the members and is often the legal structure required by governments for an organization to be eligible for funding or to carry out certain activities. There are three major types of corporate forms avail-able to charitable and not-for-profit organizations: corporations without share capital incorporated under the *Ontario Corporations Act*; corporations without share capital incorporated under the *Canada Corporations Act*; and co-operative corporations without share capital incorporated under the Ontario Corporations Act.

Trade-Mark and Domain Name Protection Primer for Charities

The Charities Directorate of the Canada Revenue Agency ("CRA") reported that as of January 2004, there were over 80,500 charitable organizations in Canada. With the increasing competition for the finite pool of available donations, there is an increasing reliance placed on the goodwill associated with a charity's name. As such, the protection of a charity's trade-mark(s) and related domain name(s) is a significant issue for charities and their boards of directors. This *Charity Law Bulletin* ("Bulletin") provides a primer on trademark and domain name protection to assist charities in preserving and advancing the goodwill they have built.
