Update on Christian Brothers

by Terrance S. Carter and R. Johanna Blom in Charity Law Bulletin No. 24, September 30, 2003.

Charity Law Bulletin No. 3, posted at www.charitylaw.ca in March of 2001, highlighted the potential impact of the decision of the Ontario Court of Appeal in the case of Christian Brothers of Ireland in Canada (Re) [2000] O.J. No. 117 (QL) and the subsequent refusal of the Supreme Court of Canada to grant leave to appeal from that decision. Specifically, Charity Law Bulletin No. 3 focused on the impact of the Court of Appeal's decision not to recognize a special purpose charitable trust as a separate trust distinct from the general corporate assets of a charity for exigibility purposes, resulting in creditors of a charity being able to seize the assets of a special purpose charitable trust held by a charity, in addition to its general corporate assets.
